

SOUTHERN OKLAHOMA SPORTSMAN'S CLUB, INC.

2012 OUTDOOR REGIONAL PISTOL CHAMPIONSHIP June 9-10, 2012

LOCATION: Davis, Oklahoma

RULES: Current NRA Pistol rules will govern throughout. Targets to be used are B6 and B8.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to any competitor. Teams will consist of four (4) firing members, one alternate, a captain and/or coach, and will represent either a club affiliated with the NRA (rule 2.11 or 2.11.1), a law enforcement agency (rule 2.14), a regular service or reserve unit (including The National Guard) (rule 2.13). The team captain and /or coach may be firing members of the team. State association teams may enter the team matches (rule 2.12). Pick-up teams will not be allowed (rule 2.10).

ENTRIES:

INDIVIDUAL: Entries in the individual events can be made by sending your entry fee to Ben Randall, 1200 E. Hanna, Davis, OK 73030. Be sure to include your current NRA classification. Send a self addressed, stamped envelope/card, or e-mail address if you wish verification of receipt of your entry.

ENTRIES CLOSE: Individual match entries will close 7:30 a.m. on Saturday (June 9, 2012). Team entries will close at the time the .22 team match begins.

ENTRIES LIMITED; Individual entries will be limited to 30 competitors.

ENTRY FEES: 3 Guns - \$55.00, 2 Guns - \$35.00 + NRA Fee, 1 Gun - \$20.00+ NRA Fee, (CMP Leg Match - \$15.00) (Distinguished Revolver Match \$ 15.00).
Team fees, per team, per gun - \$15.00

SQUADDING TICKETS: All matches will be squadded. Squadding tickets for individual matches will be issued from the stat office and will be available the afternoon prior to the first firing day. Competitors will call for these tickets as soon as they arrive at the range. Any competitor failing to obtain his squadding tickets or present themselves at the proper firing point when their relay is called may lose their right to compete in that event. Classification cards must be presented before issue of squadding tickets will be made.

CHALLENGES: A challenge fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each challenge made. See NRA Rules for correct procedure.

CLASSIFICATION: NRA classifications will be used in all matches. Individuals who have not been classified will fire in the HIGH MASTER class. Rule 19.6 (Assigned classification) may be used in making entry in a NRA registered tournament.

CATEGORIES AND CLASSES – IN AGGREGATE

AWARDS: A souvenir award will be issued to each competitor. 1st, 2nd, 3rd place open awards and 1st place team awards in the regional championship will be provided by the NRA. The S. O. S. C. will furnish awards for the individual sub-aggregate matches and the individually fired matches. The C.M.P. furnishes awards for the leg match.
NOTE: See awards schedule on the bulletin board.

CLASS AWARDS: 1st place – Trophies; 2nd, 3rd, and 4th places – NRA Award points.

CATEGORIES AND CLASSES: All competitors will compete in the civilian category. If there are less than three (3) entries in a class there will be no award in that class and all competitors will move to the next higher class. Unclassified shooters will compete in the HIGH MASTER class. No individual will be given more than one award in a single match. Winner awards will be given for each fired match. Awards will be given for each fired match on the following basis;

1st Place -----4 Competitors per class
2nd Place-----5 to 9 Competitors per class
3rd Place-----10 to 13 Competitors per class
4th Place-----14 or more Competitors per class

FIRING SCHEDULE

TIME OF FIRING: Firing will commence at 8:00 a.m. each day.

METHOD OF FIRING: There will be only one relay and the order will be as follows
Saturday: Matches 1 through 16 (2700)
Sunday: Matches 17, 18, and 19, and Service Pistol (team matches)
Match 22 C.M.P. Excellence-In-Competition Match
Match 23 Distinguished Revolver Match.

NOTE: Shooters wishing the S.O.S.C. to allow them to enter the match and bill and agency for their entry fee will have to pay by cash or check to enter the match. At such time that the S.O.S.C. receives reimbursement from sponsor agency, the S.O.S.C will write a refund check to the competitor.

A DISTINGUISHED REVOLVER MATCH

MATCH IS TO BE FIRED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING RULES

Eligibility - Only individuals who are eligible for NRA Pistol Competition pursuant to Section 2 of the NRA Pistol Rules shall be eligible to compete in this program.

Awards - The NRA Distinguished Revolver Badge will be awarded to those competitors who earn a total of 30 points through unassisted individual competition in NRA Distinguished Revolver Matches. Credit points will be awarded to the highest scoring 10 percent of all non-Distinguished Revolver competitors firing the match ranked in order of merit. Fractions of .5 and over will be resolved to the next whole number. Smaller fractions will not be considered. The winning ten percent as described above will be further broken down and credit points awarded as follows:

To the highest scoring 1/6th of the 10% qualifying - 10 points
To the next highest scoring 1/3rd of the 10% qualifying - 8 points
To the remaining competitors authorized credit points - 6 points

Course of Fire - The NRA National Match Course will be used for all competitions under this program. Tournaments wishing to host competitions under this program are limited to National Championships, State Championships, and Registered Tournaments as defined in Rule 1.6 which are conducted outdoors. Where a tournament is conducted in a single day, multiple relays of this match may be conducted **throughout** the day. Where a tournament is conducted across two or more days, multiple relays of this match may be conducted across multiple days and throughout each day.

Rule 3.1.4 Distinguished Revolver. The revolver must be capable of chambering and firing 158 grain round nose or semi-wadcutter .38 Special cartridges. It must be a factory manufactured revolver with no external modification, except for stocks which may be modified or changed because of the size of a competitor's hand or to facilitate loading. Except for stocks, and the honing of the sear or sear notch in the hammer to make a more crisp trigger pull and smooth the action and/or to maintain the required 2 1/2 pound minimum trigger pull, no external or internal modifications may be made to the revolver as manufactured and sold by the factory of origin. No parts may be removed from the revolver, either externally or internally nor may any be added. Specifically prohibited is any system of recoil control based upon compensators, barrel venting, barrel porting or weighted grips.

- A. Trigger** — Must have single and double action capability and must be capable of lifting two and one-half pounds when the gun is cocked for single action firing. Triggers will be weighed. Any trigger, sold by the manufacturer of the revolver, without modification may be used.
- B. Sights.** - Fixed or adjustable rear sights may be used. Adjustable front sights are not permitted.
- C. Barrel.** - Length not to exceed 6 1/2 inches.
- D. Stocks.** Except as set forth above, the right and left stocks must be mirror images of each other.
- E. Ammunition.** Any safe ammunition using 158 gr. Lead Semi-wadcutter or round nose bullet.
- F. The following are not allowed:** Trigger shoes, Compensators of any type or design. Any external trigger stop device or any trigger stop not originally installed by the factory as original equipment in stock revolvers of the same make and model, tape on the stocks, stocks flared at the base or any substance which results in a sticky surface to the stock or hand.
